

Date: Sunday, August 24, 2025

Course: From Isthmus, Catalina Island to Manhattan Beach Pier

This is the Super Bowl of paddleboarding – nearly 100 paddlers last year, and more coming. It's 32 miles of non stop grind. No motors, no fanfare, just pure ocean endurance. These paddlers are elite. They train like pros. They eat saltwater for breakfast. And they can't do it **without a support boat**.

Every paddler needs a chase boat to feed them, guide them, and keep them safe from Point A to finish line. That's where we come in. I've been doing this for six years, alongside my good friend Craig Allsopp, and let me tell you – it never gets old.
